Volunteer at Stewart Ave. Elementary...

Over the past few years, Villagers have donated time to tutor students at Stewart Avenue Elementary. All have been touched by the experience. Few have expressed their feelings as eloquently as Sally McDonald (with permission):

I am writing to encourage EVERYONE to consider tutoring for one hour a week at Stewart School, our adopted school. I thought about

it for several years. Finally, I decided to volunteer... I called Kathy Wightman and was matched up with Whitney, a second grader who needs help badly. Every week when I leave, I think I should be going daily.

First of all, I am extremely impressed by Stewart School-- at 130 years old it is clean with shiny, polished linoleum. The kids wear navy blue and white uniforms, and it is quiet in the halls as they go about their learning. When they change classes for music, it is fun to watch them line up; and there is a lot of "shhhhing" as they try to walk the halls quietly. (They do not entirely succeed!) The classroom size of my second grader is 22.... and many parents work second shift, so getting homework done is a bit dicey. The announcements still go on with the 'Pledge of Allegiance' being recited at 9:00 a.m. It sort of takes you back, and so far I seem to be smarter than the kids. But the teacher did tell me they added a new ocean last year, the Southern Ocean (I am still getting over Pluto).

Thankfully, most of the work is reading and arithmetic... I get there at 9 and finish by 10. Mrs. Barney, my teacher, is fine if I am traveling and have to miss a week. Stewart scores fairly high in the tests, so they are not getting some of the teachers' aides (and other help) that schools with poor test scores receive. There is a world of difference from my world on Jackson Street to these kids' homes. If they get a good foundation now, they can do well in school; if they get lost now, it is over for them.

Stewart School would welcome you, and they are very flexible on when you can come in. Not only is it important, but I feel great when I leave! They can use as many tutors as we can provide. When I was a kid, getting pulled out for extra help was not a bonus. These kids are jealous of the extra attention. So please consider it.

Al Martino

SPRINGFIELD, Pa. (AP) — Singer Al Martino, who played the Frank Sinatra-type role of Johnny Fontane in "The Godfather," died Tuesday (Oct. 13) afternoon at his childhood home. He was 82.

Publicist Sandy Friedman, of the Rogers & Cowan public relations firm, confirmed Martino's death in the Philadelphia suburb of Springfield, in Delaware County but didn't cite a cause.

Starting in 1952, Martino was known for hit songs including "Here in My Heart," "Spanish Eyes," "Can't Help Falling in Love" and "Volare."

Besides acting in the Marlon Brando classic "The Godfather," Martino sang the 1972 film's title score, "The Love Theme From The Godfather." His Fontane character is a singer and occasional actor and is the godson of Brando's Mafia boss character, Don Vito Corleone.

Martino was born in South Philadelphia as Alfred Cini and was a longtime resident of Beverly Hills, Calif.

Philadelphia radio and television personality Jerry Blavat dined with Martino and his wife on Monday night. Blavat told the Philadelphia Daily News that Martino appeared to be in fine shape and that he was shocked when he learned of the singer's death.

"He was the last of the show business legends," said Blavat, who has played Martino's songs on the radio for years. "There's nobody else. The last of the performers. A magnificent voice."
